

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

Public beliefs about the health care system in the country today




Familiarity with the Massachusetts Health Reform Law





Support for provisions of Massachusetts Health Reform Law




Support for requiring uninsured residents to purchase health insurance












Public confidence that the Massachusetts Health Reform Law will help the quality of health care in Massachusetts






Public confidence that the new Massachusetts Health Reform Law will help the Massachusetts economy




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People who think the law will help:




People who think the law will hurt:













Implications for the Future

- Need to maintain broad public support for legislation
- Legislation needs to be seen as comprehensive/many popular features/not just an individual mandate
- Educational campaigns need to focus on why mandate is critical to success
- Public skepticism about implementation needs to be addressed establish visible benchmarks
- Concerns about small business problems need to be taken seriously reduce administrative burden
- Future public support dependent upon Commonwealth-approved insurance plans being seen as affordable

Methods

The data presented here are derived from a survey of the Massachusetts public. The survey was designed by a team of researchers at the Harvard School of Public Health. The instrument was approximately 18 minutes in length. Respondents could choose to have the interview conducted in either English or Spanish. Interviews were conducted with 1,031 randomly selected Massachusetts state residents, age 18 and older, via telephone by International Communications Research of Media, Pennsylvania. The interviewing period was September 11-18, 2006. The data were weighted to accurately reflect the demographics of the state's adult population as described by the U.S. Census.

When interpreting these findings, one should recognize that all surveys are subject to sampling error. Results may differ from what would be obtained if the whole Massachusetts population had been interviewed. The size of this error varies with the number of persons surveyed and the magnitude of difference in responses to each question. The sampling error for surveys of 1,031 respondents is ± 4 percentage points.
